







Quick Reference Guide for Pharmacists 2019- Red Flags

Lung Aged 40 and over with: Persistent cough for 4 weeks Recurrent chest infections Coughing up blood • Repeated purchases of <u>cough medicine</u> **Upper GI** Aged 55 and over with: Persistent indigestion / nausea/ vomiting on most days for 3 weeks Food sticking on swallowing Repeat purchases of proton pump inhibitors (such as Nexium ®; and histamine2-receptor antagonists (e.g. ranitidine hydrochloride [Zantac®;) Aged over 50 with: Lower GI Unexplained rectal bleeding Over 60 with persistent change in the bowel habit for 6 weeks Repeat purchases of <u>haemorrhoid medicine or</u> Loperamide without diagnosis


Skin -moles



Any age:

- New mole persisting for more than 4 weeks
- Significant change in an existing mole

Renal Tract



Aged 45 and over with:

- Visible blood in the urine
- Persistent change in the bladder habit for 4 weeks
- (Problems with urination ask during medicine use review)

Head and Neck



Aged 45 and over with:

- Persistent hoarseness for 4 weeks
- Repeat purchase of throat lozenges or medicine
- Red and white patches and ulcers that don't heal within 3 weeks
- An unexplained lump in the neck, on the lips or in the mouth

Oral



Breast



Aged 30 and over with:

- Unexplained breast lump (with or without pain)
- Persistent nipple changes including discharge
