- Expand the professional relationships, network and knowledge that support independent prescribing in primary care.
- There is funding available via the ARRs scheme to support this supervision activity.

Prescribing is being integrated into the MPharm, so from 2026, all pharmacists will graduate as prescribers. By supervising an experienced pharmacist for their prescribing course, you will be supporting this workforce transformation.
